Capdeville Announces Retirement

Alex Capdeville, the longest serving CEO in the Montana University System, has announced that he will retire as Chancellor of Montana State University-Northern on December 31, 2007.

MSU officials announced that Capdeville will move to the MSU-Bozeman campus on a post-retirement contract, helping MSU in Bozeman expand the role of the two-year education in that community. He will also hold a faculty appointment with the MSU College of Education, Health and Human Development.

Sheila M. Stearns, Commissioner of Higher Education commented "It is with regret that we learn of Chancellor Capdeville's decision to retire. He has been a friend and public servant in Montana for a long time, and one whose work has brought opportunity and bright futures to Montana students. Fortunately in a post-retirement role, he will continue to bring his expertise to important educational issues in Montana. I wish him all the best."

Capdeville commented that, "I am honored that I have had the opportunity to serve as Chancellor for the past seven years. We are very grateful to the fine people of Havre for the support they have given us and the college. We will miss all of our Havre friends. I also want to extend my gratitude to the faculty and staff at Northern who have built a college that will meet the needs of the Hi-Line and Montana for many years to come."

Computer Tip of the Week: How to Sort Your Programs Menu Alphabetically

Finding programs on your Programs menu can become difficult if you've installed a lot of programs. When you install new programs, Microsoft Windows XP adds each new item to the end of the Programs menu. You can, however, quickly sort the items on your Programs menu in alphabetical order.

To sort items on your Programs menu alphabetically,

- 1. Click Start then Programs
- 2. Right-click any folder or icon,
- 3. Select *Sort by Name*.

Bonus Tip: This same tip works for your Favorites menu in Internet Explorer.
