Martha Anne Dow Passed Away

It is with sadness that we report that long time Northern alum and colleague, Martha Anne Dow, passed away Saturday, September 29. She had been diagnosed with breast cancer in April.

Martha Anne Dow earned her Bachelor's degree from Northern Montana College in 1961; Master's in 1969, and Ph.D. from the University of Hawaii in 1986.

She began working at NMC as a part time instructor in 1969 and then as Instructor in Microbiology and Director of Water/Wastewater Project in 1976. She continued at NMC throughout the years and through the ranks of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, Professor and Chair of Science & Mathematics Department. In March of 1990 she was appointed Vice President for Academic Affairs at NMC.

Martha was very well known in the Havre and campus community. It was Martha's hard work and determination that was instrumental in getting the Water Quality Program going at Northern.

She left NMC in August 1992 to assume the position of Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs at Oregon Institute of Technology in Klamath Falls, Oregon. Martha Ann was named President of OIT in May of 1998.

She leaves behind her husband of 47 years, Gary Dow, and three children and six grandchildren.

Bill Miller Coming to Campus

Bill Miller, a Native American lecturer and musician will be on campus on October 11th. At the Native American Music Awards, Bill was honored with five awards: including songwriter, Song of the Year, Folk Artist and Artist of the Year and most recently was given a Lifetime Achievement Award. He has shared the stage with Pearl Jam, Tori Amos, BoDeans, Richie Havens and Arlo Guthrie. Also in 2005, Bill won a Grammy for Best Native American Music Album (vocal or instrumental). Bill's lecture topic will be on Life on the Reservation and we have invited Fort Belknap, Hayes/ Lodgepole, Rocky Boy, Box Elder and Stone Child College to attend.
