Bio-Energy Meeting



The Industry Working Group for Bio-Energy producers, regulators and folks interested in the region conducted their meeting on campus today. There were representatives from the Montana DEQ as well as the State office for the WIRED grant and Montana Department of Labor and Industry. Producers and others include Brett Earl and Logan Fisher from the Earl-Fisher bio-diesel operation in Chester, Terry Larsen from the Stillwater Mining company – who are using various bio-diesel blends up to B70 in their equipment, John Scott from Modern Machinery and our own Jon Soriano and representatives from the Bio-Energy Innovation and Testing Center. They had a number of presentations this morning and a tour of our lab facilities and finished the day with a tour of the Earl-Fisher plant in Chester.

Photocell Goes Online

The photovoltaic (PV) power array that was installed last November is finally connected to the internet so you can monitor the power output anytime. It will also keep a running total so you can review the output on a monthly, weekly, and hourly basis. The information is available on the internet site, <u>www.fatspaniel.com</u>. The link to "live sites" is: <u>http://www.fatspaniel.com/live-sites/index.html</u>.

You can put in either Independent Power Systems (the outfit that helped us put it up) as the "Installer" or Montana State University – Northern as the "Live Site". We have generated 7.8 KWhrs today, 95.8 kWhr for the week, 3131.7 kWh since last April, and, since it was put up last Thanksgiving, it has produced 5541.1 kWhrs lifetime, into Brockmann Center. Brockmann Center used 295600 kWhrs. of power since last Thanksgiving; so, the 16 panels saved us 1.875 % of the total power used in the building.

2008 Athletic Hall of Fame Inductions

MSU-Northern and the Northern Alumni Association will recognize three outstanding individuals joining that esteemed group. Stacy L. Barnes of Great Falls, Montana, Wendy Badgett Bekkedahl of Billings, Montana, and Kevin J. Owens of Hampton, Virginia will each be introduced and presented commemorative awards in ceremonies during the halftime of the Lights/Alumni basketball game.

The alumni games begin Friday night with the Skylight's/Alumni game at 6:00 pm and the Lights/Alumni game following at 8:00 pm. The Northern Alumni Athletic Hall of Fame recognizes players, managers, and coaches for achievement of athletic honors in their sport and individuals for their outstanding and meritorious service to

Computer Tips

Word Tip: Change case in your Word documents with easy toggle shortcuts By Marianne Hoppe

Do you find yourself continually pressing the Caps Lock key to change from uppercase to lowercase, and vice versa, as you type?

Word does provide a couple of toggle key combinations you can use to change the case of selected text without retyping. For example, say you typed a line of text and want to change it to all uppercase: Just select the text and press Ctrl + Shift + A. Pressing Ctrl + Shift + A again will change it to all lowercase.

Another helpful key combination is **Shift** + **F3**, which lets you toggle case from lowercase to uppercase and then to initial caps (the start of each word is be capitalized). For example, say you just typed "To avoid injury, please read all the instructions first". Select the sentence and then press **Shift** + **F3**. It will change to all Uppercase. Press **Shift** + **F3** again and it will change to all lowercase. Pressing **Shift** + **F3** a third time will change it to initial caps.
