Congratulations ADDY® Awards Winners

Graphics Design Faculty member Norton Pease won a silver ADDY award at the District 11 level (Alaska, Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana) for his website www.wesmell.com. and Graphic Arts Student Lindsey Krause also won a silver ADDY award for her website www.ipaintgood.com.

The ADDY Awards is the largest creative competition in the country with about 55,000 local entries competing in 200 cities coast to coast. Winning an ADDY at the district level is the second step in competing for a National ADDY award. Any entry that wins a Gold or Silver ADDY at the district level is eligible to advance and compete in the national competition.

Spring Thaw Celebration



Students Make Biodiesel Presentations



MSU-N Biology majors Jessica Sorensen and Jason Wall participated at the Poster Session at the Capitol Rotunda in Helena last April 7 during the 2009 legislative session. Participants included students from different campuses within the Montana University System. Jessica and Jason were also among the 200 students who presented at the MSU Student Research Celebration at MSU-Bozeman the following week.

Both Jessica and Jason are working as Research Students at the Bio-Energy Innovation and Testing Center under the supervision of Dr. Jon Soriano, the Research Scientist at the Center. The students presented their work entitled "Crystallization behavior of biodiesel and biodiesel blends". Their research primary objective is to understand the cold-flow properties of biodiesel derived from Montana produced vegetable oils. With the use of Cold Filter Plugging Point Analyzer and Polarized Light Microscope (equipped with temperature control system), which the Center had acquired recently through a National Science Foundation Grant, the students were able to identify effective commercial anti-gel additives available locally and understand the mechanism by which these additives improve the performance of fuel during cold weather operations. Computer Tips

Colorize your Outlook messages to identify e-mail from specific senders

You can identify email from specific senders by displaying it in a distinctive color. Start by selecting an existing message from the sender in question, if you have one. If you don't, that's okay; you will also be able to enter the sender's name manually. Here are the steps.

- 1. In Mail, choose **Organize** from the **Tools** menu.
- 2. In the **Ways To Organize Inbox** pane, click **Using Colors** on the left side.
- 3. In the first condition statement (we won't use the second), choose **From** in the first drop-down list.
- 4. If you chose a message before starting, the sender's name will appear in the text box to the right. If it's not the person you want to colorize, enter the name or the person's e-mail address that you want to colorize.
- 5. Choose a color from the second drop-down list.
- 6. Click the **Apply Color** button and close the pane by clicking the **X** in the upper right of the **Ways to Organize Inbox** pane.

Outlook will now display all messages, existing and new, from the person you specified in the color you selected. You can change them back by using the steps above and selecting **Auto** as the color.
