Two Provost Finalists to Visit Campus

The MSU-Northern Provost Search Committee has reviewed over 70 outstanding applications and has decided to bring Dr. Christopher Louis Dyer and Dr. Rosalyn Anstine Templeton to campus next week to be interviewed for the Provost position. Everyone is invited to attend the two open forums next week to meet the two candidates. Dr. Templeton's open forum will be Monday at noon in the Hensler Auditorium and Dr. Dyer's meeting time will be Tuesday at noon in the Hensler Auditorium.



Dr. Rosalyn Anstine Templeton has been involved in education administration for 25 years. Dr. Templeton currently serves as the Executive Dean for the College of Education and Human Services at Marshall University in Huntington, WV, where she has held the position since July of 2005. Dr. Templeton earned her B.S. in Elementary Education Learning Disabilities and Reading from Southern Oregon University. Her M.Ed. in Emotional Disorders was earned at the American University and her Ph.D. in C&I and Ed. Policy is from the University of Oregon.

Dr. Templeton served as the Associate Dean for the College of Education and Human Services at Ferris University in Big Rapids, MI from 2003-2005, the Interim Director for the School of Education at Ferris State University from 2004-2005, the Director of the Office of Teaching Excellence and Faculty Development at Bradley University in Peoria, IL from 1999-2000, the Coordinator and Acting Chair of projects and programs at Bradley University as well as professor and assistant professor positions at Marshall University, Ferris State University, Bradley University, and Willamette University in Salem Oregon.

Dr. Templeton's refereed publications include more than 20 written works. Her non-refereed publications include two books and 13 articles. Dr. Templeton has held presentations in 13 states as well as in Canada, China, Vietnam, and Western Australia. She is also involved in community, state, and national services. Dr. Christopher Louis Dyer is an ecological anthropologist and is currently serving as the Dean of Arts and Sciences at Our Lady of the Lake University in San Antonio, TX. Dr. Dyer earned his B.S. in Fishery Biology and his B.A. in Anthropology from the University of Arizona. He received his M.S. in Marine Biology from the University of Alabama, and he earned his M.A. and Ph. D. in Anthropology from Arizona State University. Dr. Dyer has seven years of experience as a higher education administrator. He served one year as the Dean for the School for Field Studies, five years in administrative work with Mount Olive College (which has six sites in

North Carolina), and one year with Our Lady of the Lake University. While at Mount Olive College, Dr. Dyer managed academic programs that transformed the school into the fastest growing college in North Carolina.

Besides his administrative duties, Dr. Dyer has also been a professor, assistant professor, instructor, teaching associate, senior evaluation specialist, and a consultant within various colleges, totaling 23 years of involvement in higher education. He has taught over 20 different courses, and has written more than 30 published pieces. Dr. Dyer has made presentations in nine U.S. states as well as in Washington, D.C. and Mexico. Dr. Dyer is also highly involved in community and academic service, and seems to have much enthusiasm and experience to offer.

Importance of Recycling

MSU-Northern has new recycling bins, but why is the use of these bins so vitally important? Here's why.

- -A 4 ft stack of newspaper equals a 40 ft evergreen tree.
- -The average American uses seven trees a year in paper, wood, and other products made from trees. This amounts to about 2,000,000,000 trees per year!
- Approximately 1 billion trees worth of paper are thrown away every year in the U.S.
- Americans use 2,500,000 plastic bottles every hour! Most of them are thrown away!
- A modern glass bottle will take 4000 years or more to decompose -- and even longer if it's in the landfill.
- There is no limit to the amount of times aluminum can be recycled.
- A used aluminum can is recycled and back on the grocery shelf as a new can, in as little as 60 days. That's closed loop recycling at its finest!

Learning Development Offers Blended Delivery

MSU Northern has recently developed a blended model of delivery for its successful Master's program in Learning Development. The model facilitates Hi-Touch and Hi-Tech for students enrolled in the Hi-Line Cohort. The blended model will facilitate weekend delivery of face-to-face instruction at the beginning and end of each semester and on-line instruction during the semester. This Hi-Tech, High Touch approach provides graduate candidates the best of both worlds, by minimizing travel and maximizing the learning process.

The Master's of Science in Education, Learning Development program is designed for practicing teachers and other professionals engaged in supporting the learning of others. The focus of the program supports education professionals wishing to pursue an investment to acquire the knowledge, skills and dispositions to improve their teaching and their student learning in all instructional environments. The blended design supports the learning of the cohort to build long lasting and supportive relationships that will be valuable throughout their professional career.

This will be the 12th weekend offering of the program in Montana with additional cohorts being considered for Great Falls, Butte/Anaconda and Jamaica. The program is 36 hours over six semesters (summers included). The program commences fall 2010 and graduation is scheduled for summer 2012. The approximate cost for the program is \$12,500. Computer Corner

Change all the highlighted text in a Word document to another color Sometimes when you're working on, or collaborating on, a document, you may wind up with a bunch text highlighted in different colors. You can

change all the highlighted areas to a single color by doing the following:

- 1. Select your new highlight color on the Home tab (In 2003 the Highlight tool is on the Formatting toolbar)
- 2. Press Ctrl + F
- 3. Select the **Replace** tab in the Find & Replace window
- 4. Click in the **Find what**: field, then press the **More>>** button (if you have a **<<Less** button you don't need to do anything)
- 5. Click the Format button at the bottom
- 6. Select **Highlight** at the bottom of the list. (**Format: Highlight** should now appear below the **Find what**: field)
- 7. Click n the Replace with: field
- 8. Click the **Format** button at the bottom
- Select Highlight at the bottom of the list.
 (Format: Highlight should now appear below the Replace with: field)
- 10. Click the Replace All button

Bonus tip: You may also want to remove all highlighting at once. This can be accomplished by:

- 1. Select the entire document by pressing Ctrl + A.
- 2. Choose **No Color** from the Highlight drop-down list.
