He received his PhD in English /Rhetoric and Composition and his M.A. in English/Writing both from the University of Nevada, Reno. He received his B.A. in English /Teaching from Montana State University. Dr. Adkison has served in a variety of roles with Idaho State University including Associate Professor of English, Faculty Coordinator for Assessment and Program Review, and most recently the Associate Provost/Associate Vice President for Academic Programming and Review, Office of the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs. In addition, he served at the University of Nevada, Reno as a writing

consultant, graduate teaching fellow, instructor, and computer systems manager. He has authored or co-authored over 22 articles. Dr. Adkison has served as a guest lecturer for over 30 national conferences including the American Society for Engineering Education, The National Conference on College Composition and Communication, Western Literature Association, and the Practical Applications Conference on Planning, Assessment, and Institutional Research.

Governor Agrees to Speak at Graduation

Governor Brian Schweitzer is a farmer and rancher who held no elected office prior to being elected as the first Democratic Governor to serve Montana in 20 years. The grandson of Montana homesteaders, he grew up on his parents' cattle ranch in the Judith Basin. Governor Schweitzer went on to earn a Bachelor of Science degree in international agronomy from Colorado State University, and later earned a Master of Science degree in soil science from Montana State University.

Outlook Tip: Two easy ways to follow up on sent email

Inevitably, when making requests via email some will fall through the cracks and you just forget about them... until you need the information and realize the person never responded.

Outlook 2007 can help with two ways to track requests via email:

- You can flag a message you've already sent: Right-click the sent message, choose Follow Up, and then either select a preset flag (Today, Tomorrow, etc) or click Custom or Add Reminder and set a date and time. [in 2003: Right-click the sent message, choose Follow Up, and click Add Reminder]
- Or flag a message before sending it: Open a new mail message, click
 Follow Up in the Options group and select or set the flag you want. [in
 2003: Click the Follow Up button on the toolbar. Choose an appropriate flag
 or Add Reminder]

Once you've flagged a message, you can see them in the folder list by clicking **For Follow Up** in **Search Folders**. Or find them by sorting: click on the flag icon at the top of your messages, either in the Inbox or Sent Items.

Flagging a sent email won't help you get a quicker response, but it will keep the message front and center so you don't forget that you're waiting for someone to take action.
