

Northern Hosts 50Year Reunion

Montana State University-Northern welcomes the Northern Montana College Classes of 1960 back to campus on May 7th and 8th to celebrate their Golden Anniversary 50th reunion. This is a momentous occasion for the returning alums, and the schedule includes campus and community tours, class meetings, and socialization time for the class members to catch up with one another.

The reunion begins Friday, May 7th with class registration in the SUB Dining Room, followed by a luncheon featuring MSU-Northern Chancellor Dr. Frank Trocki as the speaker. A Northern Admissions representative will lead a tour of the campus after the class meeting. Friday's festivities conclude with the Founder's Excellence dinner and Reunion banquet in the Student Union Dining Room. The 50-year alumni will be introduced and receive their 50-Year commemorative pins.

On Saturday, May 8th, Montana State University-Northern's Commencement Ceremony will highlight the 50-year "Golden Grads." These 50-year alumni will march in the processional leading the new graduates in the graduation exercises. At the conclusion of Commencement, they will join the Class of 2010, their families and friends, the faculty, staff, and administration at the Student Union Building Ballroom for the graduation brunch. A tour of "Havre Beneath the Streets" is scheduled on Saturday afternoon. The final activity will be a social hour and barbecue at the Chancellor's home hosted by the Northern Alumni Association board members.

Northern Alum Named Deputy Commissioner of Education in Alaska



Les Morse of Juneau, Alaska has been named Deputy Commissioner of Education for the Department of Education & Early Development in Alaska. Morse earned his bachelor's degree in secondary education in history from MSU-Northern in 1986. During this year he was also the student body president. He went on to gain his masters' degrees in educational technology and educational leadership from the University of Alaska Southeast. He also holds an Alaska administrator's certificate with endorsements as a superintendent and a K-12 principal, and an Alaska teacher's certificate with endorsements in secondary history, business

education, and K-12 technology. Morse taught in the Hooper Bay School and in Juneau schools, and was principal of Dzantik'i Heeni Middle School in Juneau, before joining the Department of Education and Early Development in 2003 as the Director of Assessment, Accountability & Information Management.

Computer Corner

Word 2007 tip: Lost your top and bottom margins?

In Print Layout view, Word normally displays a "sheet of paper." Each onscreen border represents the edge of a single sheet. But sometimes, the top and bottom margins seem to disappear. This is a feature in Word that lets you hide the white space (including the headers and footers) at the top and bottom of a page, so you can view more content on the screen.

It's a helpful feature if you need it, but if you don't know it exists and your margins suddenly disappear, you might feel a bit confused - you won't know why the margins are gone or how to get them back.

When you move the mouse pointer to the top or bottom edge of the page, Word changes the pointer to a small icon with two arrows pointing toward each other (up and down). If you double click that icon, Word hides the white space at the top and bottom of the page.

It's just as easy to reclaim the white space as it was to lose it. Hover the mouse pointer over the top or bottom edge of the paper and click the double-arrow icon again.

If you would prefer to always work without the margins, you can set your preferences that way. In Word 2007:

- 1. Click the Office button
- 2. Click the Word Options button at the bottom of the options window
- 3. Click **Display** in the left pane
- 4. Then uncheck Show White Space Between Pages In Print Layout View
- 5. Click OK.

You can always go back and re-check the box to enable the margin display.
