Floyd Cramer is one of the most admired and beloved instrumentalists in country music history. His distinctive style at the piano, which he called the "slip note," is so uniquely his that it has become instantly identifiable and widely imitated. Exemplified by his 1960 smash hit, "Last Date," Floyd's signature sound paved the way for a successful career that spanned more than 40 years, both as a prolific solo artist and as a session pianist for innumerable country and pop legends, among them Patsy Cline, Jim Reeves, Roy Orbison, the Everly Brothers and Elvis Presley.

Word Tip
Center a page with Word's Vertical Settings

Aligning text is a simple enough task. You just select the text and click the appropriate option: Align Text Left, Center, Align Text Right, or Justify. You might not realize that Word can align text vertically as well. It's not a feature most of us would use every day. Perhaps you're creating a brochure or sign or you want to insert just a table on a page by itself. You might use blank lines to position the text or table because you don't know any other way.

Choose the Page Layout tab, click the arrow on the lower right corner of the Page Setup group. Click on the Layout tab and in the Page section, click the Vertical Alignment dropdown and choose Center. (in 2003, choose Page Setup from the File menu)
