Dress to impress - First impressions are most important. Think conservative. Wear few/minimal accessories and perfume/cologne.

Preparation - Learn to sell yourself in a short amount of time. Decide before you approach the recruiter how you will introduce yourself in one minute or less. Greet the recruiter with a firm handshake stating your name, major, graduation date and why you are attending the Career Fair. Outlook 2010

How to Resend or Recall Your Message

Earlier versions of Outlook included the ability to recall or replace an already-sent message if you and the recipient were both connected to a Microsoft Exchange server. Outlook 2010 extends that ability to any recipient who uses Outlook. Whether or not your recall or resend succeeds depends on the settings in the recipient's version of Outlook, but it's certainly worth trying when you sent a message that contains the wrong information or that contains something that you shouldn't have sent at all.

To use this feature in Outlook 2010:

1. Open the message in your **Sent Items** folder,
2. Click on the **File** tab,
3. Click the **Resend and Recall** button
4. Select either **Recall This Message** or **Resend This Message**

Outlook will try to report back to you on the success or failure of the resend or recall.

TidBit

Today marks the retirement of Janice Brady. Janice has been an employee of Northern since January 4, 1971 (approximately 14,892 days ago). To put this in perspective, President Nixon was President of the United States (several years before "Watergate"). The first man on the Moon happened only a year and a half earlier, and later that year Super Bowl VI was played. "All in the Family" was the top TV show, Carly Simon was awarded a Grammy for the Best "New Artist" and Billboard's #1 hit for the first week in January 1971 was George Harrison's "My Sweet Lord". Additionally a first class postage stamp was \$0.10, a gallon of gas was \$0.36, a dozen eggs was \$0.53 and a gallon of milk was \$1.18.

According to the Northern Montana College Catalog (1970-72) at the time, the total estimated Montana resident costs for attending the entire year was \$1,335.95, this included room and board, books, and all fees. Here on the MSU-Northern campus Dr. J.R. Crowley was President of NMC and Mackenzie Hall was not yet even in use. It opened Fall Quarter of 1971. In fact Janice has been here for all but two of the presidents and chancellors that have served here at Northern. Janice was here when football was a collegiate sport here at Northern for the first time, and she has been here longer than Northern has had women's basketball.



Did you know that Janice worked more years under the quarter system and Northern Montana College (NMC) than she did under the semester system and Montana State University-Northern (MSU-N)?

Thank you Janice for all you have done for Northern over the past 40+ years!!!!
