The MSU-Northern Lights took 10th place with a score of 50.5 at the NAIA National Championships. Three athletes made it to day two of the tournament (Brandon Weber, Andrew Bartel, and Isaac Bartel). Brandon and Isaac took second place, as Andrew took third. Both Bartels and Weber received All-American.

Andrew Bartel ends his career as a 2X All-American for the MSU-Northern Lights. Brandon Weber ends his career as a 3X All- American for the MSU-Northern Lights. He also won the NAIA National Championships in 2017, and was a 3X National finalist.

Info Session for 2020 Trip to Ireland - Mar. 13




Women's History Month Lectures

Bold Women by Elizabeth Judy – Mar. 14

This presentation, from the book of the same title, is constructed by a selection of more than a dozen women who overcame challenges, thought outside the box, adventured, nurtured, built community, and fought. These stories certainly can inspire present day women and lead them in thinking about their challenges today. These biographies go through different ethnicities, races, times, and occupations: from activists, to artists, to homesteaders, and rodeo stars. I Do: A Cultural History of Montana Weddings by Martha Kohl – Mar. 26


