The Boarding School Era: Lasting Scars



The Little River Institute sponsored and co-hosted, along with the Office of Diversity, a lecture on the impact of boarding schools by Dr. Ann Douglas in the Sweetgrass Commons of the Little River Institute on November 19 as part of Native American Heritage Month. Dr. Douglas is the director of behavioral health and prevention programs at All Nations Health Center in Missoula, Montana. As an enrolled member of the Blackfeet tribe, Dr. Douglas has dedicated her career to advocating and supporting Native youth, their families, and the community. She received her PhD in psychology from the University of Montana and completed an APA-accredited internship and post doc at Montana State University Psychological and Counseling Services. Dr. Douglas is a fierce advocate for Native youth. She has worked with and supported individuals, families, and communities to work through and heal from trauma. Dr. Douglas' lecture was attended by 80 individuals both in-person, via Zoom and by live stream in regional Tribal communities.

MAT's A Christmas Carol - December 16-18, 21-23






#352 Campus Quiz Answers
