Flint Rasmussen Announced as 2024 Commencement Speaker



Renowned entertainer and former professional rodeo clown Flint Rasmussen has been selected as the commencement speaker for the 2024 MSU-Northern graduation ceremony. Rasmussen was born in Havre and raised in Choteau, Montana where he was an All-State football player and track star at Choteau High School.

Rasmussen pursued higher education at the University of Montana Western, where he completed a double major in history and math. During his college years, he gained early experience as a sports announcer for the UMW Bulldogs and showcased his talent as a barrel clown in western Montana rodeos.

Following his graduation, Rasmussen

returned to Havre, Montana, where he taught math and history at Havre High School, coached football and track, and acted as the public address announcer for home basketball games at MSU-Northern. However, his passion for entertainment eventually led him to pursue a full-time career as a rodeo clown, a decision that proved to be immensely successful.

Rasmussen's career in entertainment reached new heights when he became the exclusive Arena Entertainer for the Professional Bull Riders (PBR) in 2006, a role he held until his retirement in the summer of 2023. Throughout his career, Flint has hosted numerous stage, TV, and radio shows, including the popular According to Flint Podcast.

Currently, Rasmussen serves as the Senior Vice President of Fan Engagement for the PBR, where he continues to make significant contributions to the Western sports world. In addition to his professional accomplishments, Rasmussen takes pride in his role as a father to Shelby and Paige, both graduates of Montana State University and College Rodeo National Champions for the Bobcats.

Flint Rasmussen's inspiring journey from a small town in Montana to the pinnacle of the entertainment industry makes him an ideal choice to impart wisdom and encouragement to the graduating class of 2024. The MSU-Northern Commencement Ceremony will be held on Saturday, May 4, from 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. in the Armory Gym.

Northern Athletic Hall of Fame

Did you know that this is the 30th anniversary of the Northern Athletic Hall of Fame? Since its inception in 1994 the Northern Athletic Hall of Fame has now inducted 93 individuals and three teams. Before you know it the 2024 nomination deadline of June 6th will be upon us.

Do you see/know someone that should be in the Hall of Fame? By my really rough estimate Northern has probably had more than 4,600 Student Athletes and coaches in its history. If you have followed Northern athletics over any period of time, you probably can think of a few that you strongly believe should be in the Hall of Fame. Did you know that anyone and everyone can submit a nomination? Here is the form if you are interested in submitting a nomination. <u>MSU-Northern Hall of Fame Nomination Form</u> As mentioned the deadline is June 6th for nominations for the 2024. Now is the time to be thinking and getting those nominations together.

While there are other items needed to complete the nomination, it all starts with the initial nomination. Read below for the Selection Committee Guidelines and Criteria.

MSU-Northern Athletics Hall of Fame Selection Committee Guidelines The Athletic Hall of Fame recognizes players, managers and coaches who have made outstanding contributions to athletics at either Northern Montana

College or Montana State University-Northern. Other individuals, for

outstanding and meritorious service to MSU-Northern Athletics, may also be recognized.

Hall of Fame honorees are presented with a commemorative award in ceremonies on campus and are included in the Athletic Hall of Fame display in the Armory Gymnasium.

The MSU-Northern Athletics Hall of Fame selection committee includes two representatives from the MSU-Northern Athletics Department, the Athletic Director at MSU-Northern, one MSU-Northern faculty member and two or more community representatives. Membership of the committee may be adjusted at any time by vote of the MSU-Northern Athletics Department.

The Selection Committee meets at least once each year to consider nominations for election to the Athletic Hall of Fame. The election of any person into the Hall of Fame requires a quorum consisting of four of the six members and a three-fourths (3/4) vote of those voting representatives for induction. For convenience, voting may be completed by electronic voting (including but not limited to the use of e-mails).

Before election of any person to the Athletic Hall of Fame, the Selection Committee requires a written "nomination" consisting of the following:

- collegiate and/or coaching records of the nominee, including conference, district and national honors and awards;
- achievements and honors since graduation/leaving Northern;
- professional and service accomplishments;
- other honors and awards;
- and a biographical sketch;
- three letters of support, with preference of, but not required from any of the following: the president, chancellor, dean or athletic director of the nominee's institution, present or past coaches, or present or former teammate.

Once made, nominations are kept among the permanent records of the MSU-Northern Athletics Department and may be carried forward in subsequent years at the discretion of the committee.

The main criteria for selection into the Athletic Hall of Fame is the achievement of individual athletic honors in the sport being considered. Consideration will be given for years participated at Northern and the number and type of All-Conference, All-District, and All-American honors achieved at Northern.

Once selected, the recipient will be required to submit a recent photograph of themselves.

Categories & Criteria for Election

The Selection Committee will use the following criteria whenever possible. If there are extenuating circumstances and the Selection Committee feels that a nominee is deserving, they may waive certain aspects.

Athlete:

- 1. The nominee must have graduated from an accredited four-year, degree granting institution.
- 2. At least two (2) years of his or her intercollegiate athletic competition must have been at Northern.
- 3. The nominee is eligible for nomination five (5) years after he or she has completed collegiate eligibility.
- 4. The nominee must have attained recognition in a sport. This recognition may include academic All-American designation.
- 5. The nominee must be of high moral character.

Coach:

 The nominee must have coached a sport or sports a minimum of ten (10) years.

OR

- The nominee must have coached at Northern for at least five (5) years.
- 2. The nominee must have attained recognition in their sport.
- 3. The nominee must be of high moral character.

Meritorious Service:

- 1. The nominee must have been involved in a sport for a minimum of twenty (20) years.
- 2. The nominee must have a maximum of their service to Montana sports.
- 3. The nominee must have attained state or national recognition.
- 4. The nominee must be of high moral character.
