Dr. Hildebrand Shares Her Research on Algal Blooms



On Wednesday, April 17, Dr. Terri Hildebrand, Professor of Biology at MSU-Northern shared the results of her "Algal Blooms Community Health Literacy Program." In her presentation, Dr. Hildebrand sought to characterize water conditions in Beaver Creek and its incoming tributaries as they exist in Beaver Creek Park in Hill County. Two seasons of data collection yielded significant baseline information on the water system's aquatic geo-morphology and chemistry. In addition, a survey assessed community knowledge of HABs. Using a Community Based Participatory Approach (CBPA) that involves regional stakeholders, results from this work may reduce the occurrence of regional HABs and improve the quality of local waters, as well as the economical and recreational opportunities they provide.

Special thank you to the many students and faculty who helped collect the monthly samples and perform the various tests. This research could not have been done without you.

The library is also celebrating National Poetry Month with a display featuring poetry books from the library's collection, encouraging readers to get inspired by this impactful literary art form.

MSUN Professor's Alzheimer Research Published in Journal of Neuropathology and Experimental Neurology



MSU-Northern's Associate Professor of Biology, Dr. Giuseppe P. Cortese, is one of nine researchers that contributed to an article recently published in the Journal of Neuropathology Experimental Neurology titled: ZCCHC17 knockdown phenocopies Alzheimer's disease-related loss of synaptic proteins and hyperexcitability.

According to the Abstract: The researchers previously found that ZCCHC17 protein declines in Alzheimer's disease (AD) brain tissue before there is significant gliosis and neuronal loss, that ZCCHC17 loss partially replicates observed splicing abnormalities in AD brain tissue, and that maintenance of ZCCHC17 levels is predicted to support cognitive resilience in AD. In this study, they assessed the functional consequences of reduced ZCCHC17 expression in primary cortical neuronal cultures using siRNA knockdown. They found that ZCCHC17 loss partially phenocopies AD-related loss of synaptic proteins and hyperexcitability.
