## Potential Northern Students Take Part in College Application Weeks

MSU-Northern is pleased to participate in College Application Weeks (Sept. 30 – Oct. 11) which provides high school seniors the opportunity to learn about Montana colleges and universities and complete a college application during the school day, thereby opening the door for many students who might not otherwise take this important step toward college. Participating high school seniors not only have an opportunity to apply to a college, but also can utilize the central application at *ApplyMontana.mus.edu* to apply to any school in the Montana University System for FREE. Last year, students at 196 public,

private, and alternative high schools submitted more than 6,000 applications through ApplyMontana.mus.edu during the two-week event.

### **Faculty Gear Up For Spring Advising**



On Wed. (Oct. 2), The Provost's office hosted the first part of a two-part advising workshop for full-time faculty. The event allowed faculty to discuss topics related to DegreeWorks, transfer students, student-athlete eligibility, and other important aspects of student advising. It aimed to introduce advising basics to faculty new to advising as well as provide additional support for those with previous advising experience. #### Student Spotlight – Breanna Marie Murphy



Breanna Marie Murphy, from Bigfork, Montana, enrolled at MSU-Northern through a transfer program from Flathead Valley Community College (FVCC), pursuing a degree in Criminal Justice with a minor in Psychology. The summer before her final year, she volunteered for the Flathead CASA program in Kalispell, serving as a Court Appointed Special Advocate for a minor in

foster care. Appointed by Judge Dan Wilson, Breanna's role involved building a trusting relationship with the child, investigating their situation, and interviewing everyone involved to determine what was in the child's best interest.

As a CASA, Breanna acted as the eyes and ears of the judge, attending court hearings, collaborating with the caseworker, and uncovering the truth in the child's case. The experience taught her valuable skills in interviewing, investigation, and navigating the complexities of the foster care system. It also provided her with a firsthand understanding of the court process and brought her classroom studies to life.

Breanna's time with CASA solidified her goal of becoming a Guardian ad Litem—a specialized attorney representing children in civil law cases, especially involving divorcing parents. After graduation, she plans to travel and study for the LSAT, aiming to attend law school at BYU or the University of Montana.


