Dr. Campbell Visits Eastern Montana



Dr. Margarett Campbell, MSU-Northern's Chief Diversity Officer, Tribal Liaison, and Advisor to the Chancellor, recently completed a weeklong recruiting tour across eastern Montana, sharing MSU-Northern's unique offerings with high school students and their families.

Dr. Campbell is a committed educator and former legislator. She was the Minority Whip in 2005 and House Majority Leader in 2009 for the Montana House of Representatives. She was the first Native and was the second woman in the History of the Montana Legislature to hold the position of House Majority Leader. Dr. Campbell is deeply invested in fostering educational opportunities

for students across the state, particularly in rural and tribal communities.

Her journey took her to Glasgow, Culbertson, Plentywood, Scobey, Fraser and Fort Peck Community College. She visited coffee shops in Scobey and Plentywood where she left information and visited about Northern.

Despite early starts and long drives, she engaged with juniors, seniors, and parents, highlighting Northern's diverse programs and welcoming campus environment. The trip resulted in 19 committed students, with 12 more interested in discussing the opportunity further with their families. Speaking directly in classrooms during the day and meeting with parents in the evenings, she shared her passion for education and the many benefits of studying at Northern.

Reflecting on the trip, Dr. Campbell noted the effort required: "It was a long and tiring trip, a lot of driving and a lot of dark miles. I had to leave by 5:45 a.m. to make it to the 8:15 classes." Though the travel was challenging, her connections with these communities made the trip immensely rewarding. Dr. Campbell looks forward to supporting prospective students in their journey to higher education, with hopes that they will soon call MSU-Northern home.

Northern Alum Wins "Tools for Schools Prize for Teaching Excellence"



MSU-Northern would like to congratulate alumnus Rob Hunter, an automotive teacher at Flathead High School in Kalispell, who was recently awarded the prestigious Harbor Freight Tools for Schools Prize for Teaching Excellence. As the only teacher in Montana to receive this honor, he was among 25 educators nationwide to be recognized for their outstanding contributions to skilled trades education.



Northern Skylights Basketball All-Time Record

I had mentioned a couple of weeks ago that while checking out the NAIA site, there is a list of the NAIA Women's Basketball All-Time Program Wins list. Unfortunately, Northern is not on that list and has not been on the list. Currently there is one current Frontier Conference school is on that list and that is Western at #23 with 813 all-time wins. Again, here is link to that list.

I had asked the question "Where do you think Northern should be on that list?" I did give a hint in that it began with the 1974-75 school year when Judy Bricker was the Head Coach for one year. According to my research over the past five years, the Northern Skylights have won 942 games versus 539 losses for a win/loss percentage of 63.61%. This should place Northern in the #11 spot or 12 spots ahead of Western.

My information and research came from the following resources. DAKstats (2003-21), Frontier Conference website (2021-24), the Northern History Book "A Northern reflection", Northerner Yearbooks, NoMoCo, Havre/Hill County Library – Havre Daily News website, Newspapers.com and MSU-Northern Archives (much thanks to Val Hickman). I also got information from every coach beginning with the Skylights very first coach, Judy Bricker. Here is the list that I have compiled:
