### Black History Month Film Series Concluded

This past Tuesday (Feb. 25) the library showed the fourth and final film in their Black History Month Film Series. The film was called *The Black Emperor of Broadway* (2020) and is a historical drama based on the true story of Charles S. Gilpin. The first Black actor to play the lead role in Eugene O'Neill's The Emperor Jones on Broadway in 1920. The film follows Gilpin's rise to fame, his struggle against racial

barriers in the theater industry, and his conflict with O'Neill over the use of racial slurs in the play. Despite his groundbreaking success, Gilpin's career is ultimately overshadowed by personal struggles and Hollywood's racial prejudices. The film highlights his significant but often overlooked contribution to American theater.

# **Alumni Spotlight: Rick Shammel**



Rick Shammel, originally from Sheridan, Montana, spent five years in the Navy, working as a jet mechanic. He honed his technical skills in a fast-paced environment, turning wrenches on some of the most advanced machines in the world. But when his military service ended, he found himself at a crossroads. He knew he wanted to continue working with his hands, but he also wanted to transition into a new industry. That's when he discovered MSU-Northern's Diesel Technology program.

Using the GI Bill, Rick enrolled at MSU-Northern, eager to build on his mechanical

background in a way that applied to civilian life. Despite his prior experience, he quickly realized that working on construction equipment was a different challenge altogether. "Turning wrenches is turning wrenches," he said, "but it's quite different."

The hands-on learning environment at Northern gave Rick the skills and confidence he needed to make the transition. He credits the program with providing him a strong foundation—teaching him not just about diesel engines, but also how to navigate and troubleshoot heavy equipment. What set his education apart was the opportunity to apply his knowledge through an internship while still in school. That experience, he says, helped him "cut his teeth" in the industry, allowing him to enter the workforce with real-world skills and connections.

After graduating in 2015 with a degree in Diesel Mechanics, Rick landed a job as a shop mechanic at RDO, working on construction equipment. His education gave him the technical expertise to diagnose and repair complex machinery, but more importantly, it taught him how to adapt, learn, and grow in his profession. "Be open to learning," he advises future students. "Don't act like you know it all—just be a sponge. Learn from everyone you can and use your resources."

Rick's journey from Navy jets to diesel engines is a testament to the power of education, adaptability, and hands-on experience. MSU-Northern not only helped him transition into a new career but also equipped him with the skills and mindset to thrive in it.

# American Indian Historical Trauma – Feb. 28

Join Us today at 4 PM in the Little River Institute for a lecture by Dr. Joseph Gone, Harvard professor and Faculty Director of the Harvard University Native American Program. Dr Gone will present in the Sweetgrass Commons.

His talk will examine the concept of "historical trauma" and its role in explaining the disproportionately high rates of mental health distress among Indigenous Americans. He will explore how colonization's legacy affects tribal

communities today and consider alternative perspectives on the link between historical oppression and contemporary mental health challenges.


