This course will prepare students to participate in productively in conflict and negotiation situations. To this proficiently students need an understanding of the nature and role of conflict in human society. This understanding requires both theoretical understanding and practical accomplishment. This course will examine conflict scenarios familiar to students and also deal with alternative dispute resolution methods such as facilitation, mediation, and arbitration. Students will practice conflict skills in simulations and other explorations. Conflict in organizational settings such as schools, civic organizations, and business will be examined.

Students should develop both a practical and theoretical understanding of conflict. The student should be able to recognize conflict dynamics and design interventions based upon this knowledge.
