Catalog Description:

This course focuses on modern and contemporary novels, plays or short stories which have been adapted to film. An emphasis will be placed on written and visual literacy as well as the relationship between film and literature.

Students will look at great works of literature that have been adapted into works of cinema, either in the US or throughout the world and discuss the original work as well as the cinematic adaptation.

Since many great works of literature from numerous cultures have been made into film, from Beowulf to Journey to the West, to Pride and Prejudice and the adaptations also reflect the historical and cultural beliefs of when and where they were made, students will be making significant comparative analyses.

Students will develop an understanding of how we define aesthetic, entertainment, and intellectual values to works of literature and film then apply that understanding to analyzing specific films.

By analyzing the films and their originating materials, students will also be identifying and working towards understanding expressions of cultural value, thus developing or deepening an appreciation for different cultures.
